Community information about levee construction



Levee Improvements Project Update:

- Trail closure and construction underway from approximately Port Royal Avenue to the San Mateo Bridge.
- Work hours: Monday-Friday 8AM–5PM, Saturday (subject to advance City approval) 9AM–4PM. Expect noise, dust, traffic delays.
- **DANGER — DO NOT ENTER FENCED AREAS.** Construction work with heavy equipment and machinery is ongoing—trespassing into fenced areas is prohibited. Even if you don't see active construction, site conditions may be unsafe and work can move quickly to different areas within the closed portion of the levee. This includes the fenced, closed Levee Trail section as well as the staging area near Sea Cloud Park, where trucks and other equipment are frequently moving within the site.

Construction work along the Levee Trail is underway from approximately Port Royal Ave. to the San Mateo Bridge. To maximize public safety, facilitate efficient construction, and maintain the project timeline, this roughly 4.5-mile section of the Levee Trail is closed to public use. As an alternative, pedestrians/bicyclists can use the Seal Slough pathway on the west side of Foster City (shown in green on reverse).

Beach Park Boulevard from approximately Shorebird Park to Bridgeview Park is being reduced to one lane in each direction, with new bike lanes and closure

of the existing temporary bike/runner lane. A portion of the roadway on the east side of Beach Park Boulevard will be used for additional construction staging for the project.

The section of Levee Trail going from Baywinds Park/East 3rd Ave. to the San Mateo Bridge is presently open, but will be closed for construction in May. The Levee Trail under the bridge is expected to remain open until April. All schedules are subject to change due to weather, unforeseen circumstances, or other factors. Residents near the levee should expect heavy equipment operating

nearby, construction noise and dust, detours, and traffic delays. Street sweeping and dust control measures are in place.

The City and its contractors will make every effort to minimize disruption and will keep you informed as the project progresses. The improved levee will better protect Foster City homes, schools, businesses, and essential City services and infrastructure during storms and high tides, and from future sea level rise. The Levee Trail will be an enhanced amenity that everyone can enjoy.
